

**1 HARBORWALK**

This is the site of many campus events, including Harbor Market, where local vendors come to campus. It's also home to our iconic bull statue – an excellent spot for a picture!

**2 JUDY GENSHAFT STUDENT LIFE CENTER (SLC)**

The SLC is the center for involvement on campus, serving as the location for many of our student organizations and student life departments. This newly renovated building is home to our Fitness Center, Wellness Center and the Career Center, among others. It is also the location of our Office of Veteran Success' Military & Veteran Success Center, which serves many military connected students as a Florida Collegiate Purple Star Campus. In this center, staff assists in VA certifications and provides resources for academic, career and wellness support.

**3 PETER RUDY WALLACE FLORIDA CENTER FOR TEACHERS (PRW)**

Many journalism classes take place here and it houses the Trafficking in Persons (TIP) lab, one of the first research centers devoted to studying the impact of human trafficking in Florida. There is a scenic outdoor courtyard that students use as a quiet study area.

**4 WILLIAMS AND SNELL HOUSES**

These early St. Petersburg landmarks were donated to the university. The Williams House was built in 1891 and moved to its current location in 1995. It is on the U.S. National Register of Historic Places and houses academic offices. The Snell House was built in 1903 and moved in 1993. It is the home to the Florida Studies Program and the Judy Genshaft Honors College at USF St. Petersburg.

**5 PELICAN APARTMENTS (PEL)**

This 350-bed residence hall features apartment style living with single and shared bedrooms. Rooms have shared kitchens and living areas. There are common lounges on each floor, vending machines on every other floor and laundry on five floors.

**6 CAMPUS BOOKSTORE (BKS)**

On the second floor, Bulls can get their textbooks, supplies and online order pick-ups. Leisure reading, reference materials and Bulls gear are on the first floor. The café inside serves pastries and Starbucks coffee.

**7 UNIVERSITY POLICE DEPARTMENT (POL)**

The USF St. Petersburg Police Department is a professionally accredited and state certified law enforcement agency. Officers patrol campus and surrounding areas 24/7 and offer escorts. You may even meet our police comfort dog, Snowbird, on your tour.

**8 OSPREY SUITES (OSP)**

Our newest residence hall has five floors, accommodating 375 residents. The suite-style rooms offer either private bedrooms or shared bedrooms with a bathroom and living area.

**9 THE NEST**

This innovative, all-you-care-to-eat facility is located on the first floor of Osprey Suites. It features modern menu concepts such as: True Balance, an Allergen Zone Kitchen; an international station serving global flavors; a plant-based station; and a variety of other options such as pizza/pasta, salads, grill, home cooking, desserts, cereal, coffee bar and more.

**14 BAYBORO HALL (BAY)**

This is where you'll find many of our administrative offices, including Undergraduate Admissions, Campus Visitation, Pinellas Access to Higher Education (PATHe), the Office of Financial Aid, Campus Computing (IT) and the Registrar.

**15 HARBORSIDE LAWN**

Harborside Lawn hosts events throughout the school year, such as carnivals, outdoor laser tag, a cardboard boatrace – a favorite campus tradition - and many more!

**16 DAVIS HALL (DAV)**

This home for the College of Arts and Sciences on our campus has classrooms and faculty offices. It also contains Undergraduate Studies, which includes Exploratory Curriculum, Success Advocates and the Debbie Nye Sembler Student Success Center (offering free tutoring, writing assistance and even a Math lab) located on the first floor.

**17 HELLER HALL (HWH)**

The first floor houses New Student Experience/Parent & Family Engagement and the Office of Orientation. These areas support students and their family members as they are on-boarded to our campus through services that promote student success. Located on the second floor is the College of Education on our campus, which houses classrooms, faculty offices and the STEM Inquiry Innovation Lab where students learn and develop skills in educational technology.

**18 THE EDGE**

The Edge houses two meeting rooms, an outside deck, a lounge, a pool and a gaming area. It includes a pool table, foosball, table tennis as well as TVs and ports for video gaming consoles. The Edge is able to host viewing parties for USF Athletic competitions and other sporting events.

**19 KNIGHT OCEANOGRAPHIC RESEARCH CENTER (KRC)**

This facility houses classrooms, offices, the Dean's suite and science labs, including a large research aquarium. Faculty labs study everything from marine microbes through microscopes to large scale ocean processes by satellite.

**20 MARINE SCIENCE LABORATORIES (MSL)**

Originally built as a training facility for the U.S. Merchant Marine, MSL is now home to various research labs, offices, conference rooms, a student lounge and even a machine shop. MSL also houses groups such as the Center for Ocean Mapping and Innovative Technologies and the Florida Institute of Oceanography.

**21 SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY BUILDING (STG)**

This academic building houses classroom space as well as science laboratories and faculty research labs (where many undergraduates work with faculty on projects). It was the first LEED Gold Certified building at USF, which means it is environmentally friendly with a low carbon footprint. The St. Pete campus has 6 LEED Certified buildings.

**22 UNIVERSITY STUDENT CENTER (USC)**

The University Student Center is the living room of campus, featuring three large ballrooms, meeting rooms, and lounge spaces for students to relax, game and study. It also offers several dining options, including Kahwa Coffee and 727 Eats at the Reef, which has specialty grab 'n' go options including Bento Sushi and a variety of beverages. Ibis residence hall is connected to the USC and houses approximately 220 residential students.

**10 CHILDREN'S RESEARCH INSTITUTE**

Home to the College of Nursing on our campus, this facility contains teaching and operation spaces to provide scenario-based learning experiences for future nurses. The St. Petersburg Nursing Simulation Lab is located on the second floor, which is designed to immerse students in realistic healthcare environments.

**11 LYNN PIPPENGER HALL (LPH)**

This award-winning-designed building is home to the Kate Tiedemann School of Business and Finance, one of only a few university buildings named after (and by) a woman. It is home to the USF Fintech Center and the Merrill Lynch Wealth Management Center, where students manage investment opportunities using real capital.

**12 HARBOR HALL (HBR)**

Home to the Graphic Arts program, Harbor Hall used to be the original site of the Salvador Dali Museum. The recently renovated building offers gallery and studio spaces and an aesthetically modern environment for students to showcase their work.

**13 NELSON POYNTER MEMORIAL LIBRARY (POY)**

There are more than 240,000 print books in our newly renovated library, and students have 24/7 access to over a million electronic resources through a partnership with all USF campuses. There are also recreational readings, popular magazines and graphic novels. Plus, there's free printing.
