Florida Solar by the numbers

- 40 Solar co-ops implemented in Florida since 2015
 - 7 within Tampa/St. Pete region
- 6,000+ homeowners educated through information session and our email campaign.
 - 1,605 within Tampa/St. Pete region
- We have helped 1,237 homeowners go solar across Florida, resulting in \$24,219,000 million of economic investment.
- Over 11 Megawatts of total installed capacity.
- Our work has created 328 solar jobs
