Can you believe the end of the semester is upon us? Your student will be headed into the Winter Break in no time. This can be a hard time for your student, as they are finishing their fall courses. If they need help, your student can access the following resources:

- <u>Making an appointment</u> within the Student Success Center for tutoring, writing consultations, and more.
- Utilizing the Group Study Rooms within the Library, make sure to reserve them through the <u>online portal</u>.
- Working with their <u>Student Success Advocate</u> or their <u>academic</u> <u>advisor</u> to create time management techniques.

Here are some other reminders for your student:

- Spring registration has officially opened! Don't let your student delay in getting the classes they need; in the format they want (virtual/in-person/hybrid). Registering is very simple. Students should log into MyUSF, access their OASIS account, and check their registration time under the Registration Status link. They should also check for any holds (under Registration Status in OASIS) and clear them to avoid any registration delays. The three most common holds are: CC, AA and AR. Learn more about what these holds mean here. Remind your student to meet with an Academic Advisor to make sure they are registering for the right classes. The last day to register for Spring without a late registration fee penalty is Jan. 7, 2022. We encourage students to register before winter break begins.
